


Dr Sunith Kumar G, our key note speaker gave key points on the topic

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




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SEMINAR ON INCLUSIVE EDUCATION

strategies and practices to create a more inclusive environment for students with diverse needs within higher education institutions.


Key Speakers:



knowledge and skills gained by the participants are expected to have a lasting impact on their teaching practices, ultimately benefiting students with diverse learning needs






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INSTITUTIONAL POLICY REVISION

- Aesthetically pleasing and well-maintained outdoor spaces, including gardens, courtyards, and walkways



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

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
